TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Mayor Credle asked Town Manager Lynn Davis to present her monthly report. Manager Davis reported on the following initiatives:

• The town office is closed to the public at least until the end of April. A new "no cash" policy is now in effect for utility bills paid through the drop box. Customers have been informed to pay their bills with a check or money order when using the drop box method. This policy is in place to protect both the customers and town employees. Customers also have the option to pay their utility bills over the phone with a debit or credit card.

 Management continues to participate in webinars and live broadcasts from the Governor's office to keep abreast of recommendations regarding COVID-19. The town is using Civic Plus, a notification system, the town's Facebook page and the town's website to get the word out to the public.

Governor Cooper's Executive Order 124 issued on April 1 directs all utilities departments
to suspend disconnections for non-payment for at least 60 days for residential
customers. The town has been receiving reports from the state and the town's finance
officer is monitoring revenue loss. Town employees have been encouraging customers
to continue to pay utility bills while the suspension is in effect. FEMA has declared our
region a disaster area due to COVID-19. Belhaven is already registered with FEMA.
 With the declaration of our region as a disaster area, the town will be eligible for federal
assistance through FEMA.

NEW BUSINESS

Adoption of Leak Adjustment Policy

In 2018, the Town of Belhaven adopted a new utility policy. That policy did not specifically address water leaks. Town staff has researched the policies from other townships and has determined that adding a leak adjustment policy would be a good policy to have in place. The policy addresses responsibility of the customer, a process for an adjustment request, method of calculating adjustment if one is needed, and statute of limitations on request. The policy also

addresses pool fills. It allows for one pool fill per year, but an application must be completed.

A Copy of the Water Leak Adjustment Policy, Adopted April 13, 2020 is herein attached by reference as "Attachment A"

A motion was made by Alderman Linton to adopt the Leak Adjustment Policy as presented. Alderman Cherry seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.

Code of Ordinance Amendment – Powers Granted to Mayor

State statutes allow county and municipal leaders to enact a state of emergency for their jurisdiction if this power is specifically stated in local ordinances. The Town of Belhaven's ordinance does not grant this power to the Mayor. In times of emergencies, it may not be possible to convene the Council to vote on a declaration.

Staff recommends that the Council grant the Mayor the authority to make a determination of a state of emergency with restrictions authorized, to declare prohibitions and restrictions, to authorize evacuations, curfews, restrictions on alcoholic beverage possession, consumption or transfer, restrictions on possession, transportation and transfer of dangerous weapons and substances, area access restrictions, movement of people in public places, operation of businesses, offices, etc. and the amendments/superseding of such declarations. This is in accordance with Section 30.30 State of Emergency language to Title III of the Town of Belhaven Code of Ordinances.

A motion was made by Alderman Cherry to approve the Code of Ordinance Amendment allowing powers granted to the Mayor as outlined. The motion was seconded by Alderman Linton. The vote passed 4-0.

Approval of Grant Agreement for Building Inspector Position

The town applied for and was awarded a grant to fund a position of building inspector/code enforcement officer for 3 years from the NC Office of Recovery and Resiliency. Manager Davis requested the approval and execution of the official MOU agreement between the Town of Belhaven and the NC Office of Recovery and Resiliency.

A motion was made by Alderman Cherry to approve the MOU between the Town of Belhaven and the NC Office of Recovery and Resiliency. The motion was seconded by Alderman Ward. The motion passed 4-0.

Recreation Department Refunds

Many of the municipalities and recreation departments across the state are cancelling the spring sports activities and refunding registration fees due to COVID-19. The opening day for baseball/softball/T-ball in Belhaven was scheduled for early April; however, given the uncertainty of scheduling and reorganization of the activities, the town has chosen to follow suit and cancel organized youth sports this season and would like to refund registration fees.

140	Alderman Radcliffe asked if the town is planning to refund sponsorships as well. Sponsors will				
141	be given the choice of a refund or a retainer for the next season.

144	baseball and softball for the Spring 2020 season. The motion was seconded by Alderman				
145	Linton. The motion passed 4-0.

148	Alderman Ward thanked the town for allowing the Easter service at the Market to go on as				
149	scheduled with everyone participating in social distancing.

151	Alderman Cherry informed everyone that the peak in infection rate of COVID-19 is not expected				
152	until May. She urged everyone to remain diligent in protecting themselves and others during				
153	this uncertain time.

155	Mayor Credle reiterated Alderman Cherry and Ward's comments and thanked everyone for				
156	their good faith efforts to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
